YOUNGEST : Oh, that one! That one! If I do not marry him, I shall have none.

NARRATOR : When the King returned from the hunt, he sent for the sisters. All three girls were beautiful, especially the eldest sister who had hair the color of flax, which is a very light pale blond.

NARRATOR : The sisters played coy with the King.

MIDDLE and

is thy tomb.

NARRATOR : The King later returned and the two sisters told him that the Queen had given birth to a dog.

NARRATOR : Meanwhile, a fisherman found the little Prince in the water and he was not dead, so he took the baby home with him. The fisherman and his wife had no children and they were more than happy to raise the little Prince as their own.
